

NEW CAYMAN ISLANDS GOVERNMENT FEES FOR 2024

The Cayman Islands Government announced on 1 November 2023 an increase in the Government fees charged for Cayman companies, effective 1 January 2024. This is the jurisdiction's first increase in Government fees in 10 years and reflects the investments the Cayman Registrar of Companies has made during that time, particularly in technology.

The increase for each category of company is detailed below.
